Headings (Times New Roman 30pt)

Heading 1 as the largest headline should be particularly appealing (present the gist of the project in short terms). If Heading 1 is interesting to the audience, the next largest heading will be read, this can be somewhat more detailed, etc.

Text (Times New Roman 30pt)

Organize your poster as clearly as possible and limit yourself to the most important information. Please do not change the front size of 22 pt. Italic text is not recommended and you should also not use too much bold text apart from the headings.

Images

Please use only one image. Please make sure your image show the main key aspect of your work.

Apart from Heading 1 the images will be what captures the eye of the audience first and are thus essential for your poster. **DO NOT CHANGE THE SIZE AND POSITION OF THE IMAGE!!!** Images should always contain a caption with information about the image and the authorship. The quality of your images is also important. Images should in general have 300 dpi. Consult your supervisor, if you feel uncertain about the quality.
